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	All children are inspired to participate in regular physical activity.	As well as The Premier Education Group providing a 1 hour Performing Arts or Sports session to each class every week, lunchtime and after school clubs are provided by the group as well as the PE Leader. A Change4Life club has been organised and is now being run by Y6 pupils with the help of the Y5 teacher. The Y5 teacher received training from Agilitas Sports Partnership.	
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport.	All children will have increased opportunities for learning new skills and applying such skills within a range of sports and physical activities.	Coaches from Chance to Shine organisation have been bought in, in order to give the children in KS2 extra tuition in cricket. Teaching staff are also present at these sessions in order to develop their own skills. Links with the local Secondary School provides opportunities for KS1 children to benefit from coaching in multi-skills. Teaching staff attend these coaching sessions to develop their own skills. All teaching staff accompany their class when being taught by Premier Education coaches.
